


THIS STEP REQUIRES:

SCREW DRIVER (Not Included)



A. Place the changing topper on top of the dresser. The holes in back side should be below Dresser top surface. (see diagram)



B. Insert the screws into the back of the changing topper and dresser, tighten with Screw driver. Check to see that the changing topper is secure.

CAUTION: ANY PAD USED IN THIS CHANGING TOPPER MUST BE AT LEAST 16 INCHES BY 32 INCHES (41CM X 81CM) WITH A THICKNESS NOT EXCEEDING 1 INCH (2.54 CM).
